

B 334: Report on Bernd B.' escape attempt.

The construction of the Berlin Wall evoked anger and outrage among residents on both sides of the city. In West Berlin the ongoing resentment was specifically expressed by attacks on the fortifications and guards. On April 10, 1962, teenagers at Ackerstrasse threw stones at border guards, injuring one. They reacted by throwing smoke grenades over the Wall to scare off the youths.

At around 1:30 a.m. on August 30, 1961, Hannelore B., Margot St. and Ursula S. fled from an apartment at Bernauer Strasse 2. The border guard observed objects being thrown down to the pavement from a window, but was unable to see more because the West Berlin police glared floodlights at him. An investigation found that the tenant had slid down a rope with two friends.

At midday on August 19, 1961, two unknown persons slid down a rope from the first floor of the corner building at Ackerstrasse 43.


Bernd B. tried to climb over the Wall near the Reconciliation Church on the night of July 7, 1968. He approached the border strip from the Elisabeth parish cemetery and got past the signal the window. fence and anti-vehicle obstacle. Shielded by the Reconciliation Church, he crawled within five

meters of the Wall at which point he was noticed by the border guard on the watchtower at Ackerstrasse. The guard called out to him and fired a warning shot. When Bernd B. responded by trying to jump onto the Wall, the border soldier fired at him. Bernd B. was critically injured and dragged behind the church - out of view of the West. After undergoing an emergency operation in the Police Hospital, he was handed over to the secret police. The border soldiers involved in the arrest were honored with medals and awards.

The border soldiers thought he was working there. From the attic of Bernauer Strasse 13 he broke through a window that had already been walled up and used his chimney-sweep rope to let himself down to Bernauer Strasse church, they waited in a building uninjured. The border guard posted at Bernauer Strasse 6 did not notice the escape until the man was running across the street. Disciplinary action was taken against two squad leaders.

At midday on December 6, 1961, Private K. was on duty at Strelitzer Strasse. He stood directly in front of the Wall. His guard leader was monitoring Strelitzer Strasse, sixty meters away. A screen positioned between them prevented the squad leader from seeing K. when he climbed over the Wall shortly past noon. Private K. had been transferred from the rio police to border duty and was critical of the Wall because it separated families. His brother and sister lived in the West.

Hildegard K. worked as a singer

for East German radio. The religious mother of four children risked losing her job because of her criticism of the propaganda in songs. For this reason she decided to flee in summer 1961. of her belongings to West Berlin. On August 12 she sent three of her children to friends in the West. closure the next morning, she tried to find a way to flee with her eldest son, Klaus-Peter. Hildegard K. knew that the Reconciliation Church stood directly on the bor der. After trying several times unsuccessfully to get past the many obstacles on the way to the on Strelitzer Strasse for nightfal They worked their way through backyards to the Elisabeth parish cemetery. Shielded by the gravestones, they crawled to the Reconciliation Church, whose gate was still open to West Berlin and were able to pass through it without being noticed.

Gerd Sch. almost succeeded in fleeing to the West on August 17, 1962, but was apprehended by border guards just before he reached the Wall at Ackerstrasse.

On August 13, 1961, the border fortifications on Ackerstrasse consisted only of loosely laid-out April 25, 1980. He had climbed rolls of barbed wire. Heinz V. had just about completed his doctorate degree at the Humboldt University in Berlin by summer 1961. He had joined the line. After the Wall was built, he decided to flee. He belonged to the worker's militia of the Academy of Sciences. On September 24 1961, he was assigned to assist in the evacuation of the border houses. When the border guard briefly left the balcony door, Heinz V. seized the moment and jumped from the first floor of Bernauer Strasse 6. He injured himself badly and spent many weeks in the hospital.

On August 26, 1961, a woman iumped to the West from the first floor of a building at Bernauer Strasse 2. The West Berlin police brought the injured woman to

Rudolf K. was able to sneak unnoticed into a room facing Bernauer Strasse. He called West Berlin policemen over and they positioned a truck beneath the window, K. jumped from the first floor onto the truck which drove off immediately. When the East German police broke open the door, Rudolf K. had already made it safely to the West.

As border guards were forcing their way into the apartment, her husband dropped their five-year-old son down

On December 5, 1961, a 27-yearold man was able to flee to the West from the first floor of the building at Bernauer Strasse 2. He managed to reach the border houses, most of which had been evacuated, by crossing through backyards unnoticed. B 354: Escape across rooftops

On the morning of October 25, 1961, residents of the building at Ackerstrasse 42, which did not stand directly on the border, were evicted from their apartments. The curtains were left hanging on the windows to cover up the extent of the evictions. The evacuation of all buildings on Bernauer pleted three days earlier. In May 1962, Dieter T., who was

On September 19, 1961, a person fled across the rooftop of the building at Ackerstrasse 42.

After the Knittel family decided to flee from Bernauer Strasse 8 on September 19, 1961, they notified the West Berlin fire brigades. Firemen arrived with a rescue net around 10 p.m. Helga Knittel, who was heavily pregnant, was the first to jump out the second-story window. She was followed by her daughter Marina and then the father. The escape had been wellprepared, allowing them to take some of their personal belongings with them. Three days after the escape. Helga Knittel gave birth to her second daughter in West Berlin.

When Anni M. returned from vacation on September 27, 1961, the evacuation of the border houses had already begun. She decided to flee that very day. Late in the evening a neighbor heard suspicious-sounding noises and notified the border guards. When they broke open the apartment door, they found a rope hanging from the window that was wrapped around the sofa. At around 9 p.m., Anni M. had taken her valuables and escaped down the rope to the pavement on the west side.
